Are you passionate about space? Are you interested in both the scientific and Navajo traditional knowledge about the Sun, the Moon, and the planets? Are you a student in grades 6-12?

If the answer to these questions is yes, then you are enthusiastically invited to apply to participate in our Summer Camp: Wót'ááłdi Áłchíní bee Na'nitin! The camp features field trips to sites on the Navajo Nation where students will explore scientific and traditional Diné knowledge. Students will also receive classroom instruction, the opportunity for telescope viewing of the night sky, and guidance in research projects. NASA scientists, traditional medicine men, teachers, and the Navajo Nation Department of Diné Education will be present at all times to facilitate knowledge development.

Who: Students from across the Navajo Nation in grades 6-12 are eligible

What: Residential Summer Camp, meals and overnight lodging provided

Where: Navajo Technical College, Crownpoint, NM

When: Monday-Friday, July 11-15th

How: 25 winners of an essay competition will be selected to participate!
